The following is a description and dimensions:—

The right arm, in the thickest part, measures 12 in. round, and his left arm 15 in. round; he has three ribs more on the skeleton side than any other man; the shoulder blade resembles a duck's wing; the collar bone resembles two human fingers; the left side is that of a woman, with a woman's breast, and one rib less than any other man; and singular to state, the right leg is a finely formed and well developed one, being 25½ in. round the calf, while the left leg is a skeleton one, being but 4½ in.; and on the opposite side to the skeleton body, the foot has three ankle joints, the flexibility of which is truly wonderful; he has two different hearts and pulsations.

The public will please to take notice that he is not exhibited as a living skeleton; if he were, then there might be raised a reasonable objection, as many might say he had been starved to it; but it is a thing impossible to Feed one side and Starve the other.
