upper Moorfields, is to be seen a Miracle in Nature, being a Woman that has a Horn growing on the back Part of her Head, full 10 Inches long, curled and twisted very beautifully, resembling a Sheep's Horn, and grows out of a Bunch like a Wen; she has likewise several of the like Bunches on her Head, which is thought will

produce the like Horns. She has been viewed by Sir Hans Sloane and the Royal Society, who allow her to be the greatest Rarity they ever saw.

Also the greatest Piece of Art that ever the World produc'd, being a curious Piece of Machinery, that performs an extraordinary Entertainment of Musick upon Variety of Instruments; and what is still more wonderful, this curious Piece of Work gives an Entertainment of an Avery of Birds, where the Notes of most choice Song Birds are so well imitated, that Life itself hardly exceeds it, the like never expos'd to publick View before. To be seen every Day from Ten in the Morning, till Eight at Night, without loss of Time.

Note, Likewise at the same Place will be perform'd Fawk's Dexterity of Hand and Posture Master, beginning every Evening at Five a Clock, and again at Seven.
