SUDDEN DEATH OF MRS. ARMITAGE.—This celebrated character expired suddenly on Friday evening, at the rooms where she had been exhibiting, in New-street, Birmingham. It appears that she had just come from the Swan Hotel, where she had been staying, when, on entering the exhibition room, she was seized with a shivering fit, and expired before her medical attendant could arrive. She belonged to Norwich; but two or three years back she resided in Brydges-street, Covent-garden, and went from there to Scotland, and other large provincial towns, where she exhibited herself. During one of her journeys it was found necessary to fit up a horse-box in one of the trains on the railway, no carriage being sufficiently large to contain her body. The last places she exhibited at in London were the Strand Theatre and the Cosmorama Rooms, Regent-street. The deceased weighed 31 stone 11 pounds, was four feet round the waist, six feet round the bust, seven feet one inch round the hips, and 22 inches round the upper part of the arm. She ate her dinner about an hour before her death.
