On Wednesday morning last died, at the house of Mr. Richardson, Horsemonger-lane, Southwark, aged four years and nine months, *George Alexander*, the late celebrated and surprising spotted West Indian, who, when alive, was the theme of universal admiration, not only for the very singular marks which it pleased the Almighty to distinguish the works of his creation from the rest of the human race, but the playful and endearing manner with which this late wonderful infant prepossessed all ranks of persons in his favour that visited him. Too much praise cannot be bestowed on his patron, Mr. Richardson, for his kind and tender treatment, in sparing neither expence nor pains, during many months suffering anguish, to procure the first medical aid. The child was attended by Dr. Dundas (of Richmond), Mr. Astley Cooper (City), Mr. Phillips (Southwark), and Mr. Scott (Bromley, Kent); of which latter place he was at nurse for many months previous to his death. The child was baptized at Newington, Surrey, on his arrival from the West Indies, when fifteen months old; and, after a lingering suffering for a considerable time, departed this life, in consequence of a gathering in the jaw.
