PRESENTATION AND BASIC NHS COST

PRESENTATION AND BASIC NHS COST Becotide Rotacaps contain a mixture of microfine beclomethasone dipropionate BP and larger particle lactose in buff or chocolate-brown/colourless hard gelatine cartridges. Each Rotacap contains 100 micrograms (buff) or 200 micrograms (chocolate-brown) and is marked Becotide 100 or Becotide 200. Containers of 100 Becotide Rotacaps 200 micrograms £4.41. Containers of 100 Becotide Rotacaps 200 micrograms £5.88. Becotide Rotahaler is individually boxed in a plastic container, which has special compartments to accommodate the daily dosage requirement of Rotacaps. Basic NHS cost of a Becotide Rotataler is 50.

Basic NHS cost of a Becotide Rotahaler is 65p. It is advisable that a new Becotide Rotahaler is prescribed every 6 months.

INDICATIONS

For the control of asthmatic symptoms when glucocorticoid therapy is indicated or to replace or reduce the dosage of systemic glucocorticoids or ACTH in asthmatic patients dependent on such treatment for their well-being.

DOSAGE AND ADMINISTRATION

Adults: The usual maintenance dose is 1 Rotacap 200 micrograms 3 or 4 times a day by inhalation. Children: 1 Rotacap 100 micrograms 2, 3 or 4 times a day, by inhalation, according to the

CONTRA-INDICATIONS, WARNINGS, ETC. Special care is necessary in patients with active or quiescent pulmonary tuberculosis. The maximum daily inhaled intake of beclomethasone dipropionate should not exceed Img; significant reduction of plasma cortisol levels has been reported in patients who received twice this amount. Unnecessary administration of drugs during the first trimester of

Twice this amount. Unnecessary administration of drugs during the first trimester of pregnancy is undesirable. Replacement of systemic steroid treatment with Becotide Rotacaps sometimes unmasks allergies such as allergic rhinitis or eczema previously controlled by the systemic drug. These can be treated with antihistamines and/or topical preparations. Candidiasis of the mouth and throat (thrush) has been reported in some cases. It usually

DUNNOCK

Prunella modularis

The Dunnock or Hedge Sparrow is a familiar resident of this country; it may be seen almost anywhere. Largely a ground feeder, it lives on insects during spring and summer, as its small, sharp beak shows - in contrast to the thick bill of the House or Tree Sparrows. In winter it takes small seeds. The song is high-noted and repetitive; it has a shrill, squeaking call. Cuckoos often use the nest of the Dunnock. Both sexes take part in the courtship display, spreading shaking wings and flicking the tail on the ground. They build a small and comfortable cup-shaped nest of grass, hair or moss in a bush or hedgerow. Three to five bright blue eggs are laid in each clutch, of which there are usually two or three annually. Male and female are similar in appearance. They attain a length of $5\frac{3}{4}$ inches (15cm).
