#### HAMPTON

The village of Hampton stands on the Middlesex bank of the Thames beyond Hampton Court and is here seen, as it was in 1845, from the towpath on the Surrey side. Prominent on the left is the tower of the parish church of St. Mary, built by Lapidge in 1831. On the right is Hampton House, bought in 1754 by David Garrick and twice altered for him by Robert Adam. The miniature temple on the river bank below it was built to house the statue of Shakespeare by Roubiliac.
