QUADRANT, REGENT STREET. Regent Street is part of John Nash's great highway between Carlton House and Regent's Park, built for George IV between 1813 and 1830. It was designed to run straight north from Carlton House to the County Fire Office, shown in the right foreground, and then in a curve—the Quadrant—to strike Oxford Street at right angles and continue northwards to the Park. The Quadrant had an elegant colonnade surmounted by a terrace, but this vanished when it was rebuilt by Sir Edward Blomfield 1920-1923. In this view, taken about 1850, a detachment of Horse Guards rides towards Oxford Street.

Syrup: 3 mg perphenazine BP per 5 ml dose in bottles of 150 ml and 2 litres.

Injection: 5 mg perphenazine BP in each ampoule of 1 ml. Boxes of 5 and 100 ampoules.
