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BILLINGSGATE

Billingsgate Dock took its name from Belin's Gate, one of the two gates in the river wall of the old Roman city. Early chroniclers believed Belin to be a British King of 400 B.C. but Stow discredits this. First a landing place for general cargo, then a corn market, it became a fish market in 1699. It remained in the form of a dock until about 1849, when it was filled in and the market sheds rebuilt by the City architect, J. B. Bunning. The engraving shows the dock shortly before this was done, with the top of the Monument visible above the roofs on the left and various sailing craft assembled in the foreground while their crews are rowed ashore.
