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BUCKINGHAM PALACE was originally a country house of the Duke of Buckingham. Charlotte, consort of George III, moved there in 1762 and John Nash converted it into a royal palace for George IV about 1830, it was replaced shortly afterwards by Edward Blore, who altered the design and completed the building in 1837. The picture shows the palace as it appeared before the removal of Nash's Marble Arch, of 1828, to its present site at the north-east corner of Hyde Park in 1851.

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
