Horse Guards. William Kent designed the Horse Guards building in Whitehall about 1745, but it was in fact erected after his death by John Vardy. Its west front faces St. James's Park, its east front looks across Whitehall to Inigo Jones' Banqueting House. The daily changing of the Guard is today a popular tourist attraction. The picture shows the Park front, with Horse and Foot Guards parading in the forecourt. To the left is the Admiralty, built by Thomas Ripley in 1722-1726.
