HOUSE OF LORDS. In 1834 the whole of the Palace of Westminster, or Houses of Parliament, was destroyed by fire, with the exception of Westminster Hall, the adjoining law courts and the crypt of St. Stephen's Chapel. From 97 designs submitted for a Gothic or Elizabethan replacement, Parliament chose that of Charles Barry, who was assisted by A. W. Pugin. The foundation stone was laid in 1840, the House of Lords occupied in 1847 and the Royal Entrance first used by Queen Victoria in 1852. Neither the Clock Tower nor the Victoria Tower was completed when this picture was drawn, hence certain inaccuracies are to be found. Most of the craft shown on the river are sailing boats, but there is also a steam "water bus" and a dumb barge floats down river, guided by a man with a large oar or "sweep".
