GOLDEN EAGLE

Aquila chrysaëtos

A magnificent bird of prey, with a wing span of up to 84 in (210 cm). Mainly confined, in Great Britain, to mountainous areas of the Scottish Highlands. Climbs to great heights in search of food, then drops at speed upon rabbits, hares and even animals as large as lambs, grasping them in its powerful talons. Will also devour game-birds (such as grouse) or strike another large bird on the wing. Generally silent, but occasionally gives vent to a sharp, yelping scream. Builds a large nest on a remote crag—sometimes also in a tree. The nest may grow to an enormous size (about three metres across) and is made of sticks and branches, lined with sprigs of deciduous trees. Normally lays two eggs: whitish, mottled with russet undermarked by grey. Male and female are similar except for size—the female is larger, growing to a length of 35 in (89 cm).
