

SELECTED BIRDS OF BRITAIN

OSPREY (Fish hawk) Pandion Haliaetus

A rare summer visitor. Driven from Britain in the interests of fish protection, it has recently reappeared nesting on remote Highland lochs where there are currently some 14 pairs. Never found far away from water, they fly slowly with deliberate strokes of their long narrow wings, in the search for fish. The usual call is a short, melodious whistle, but there is considerable variation in cries, which are matched to their activities. Builds large nests made of sticks or debris, in trees or on the ground near water; these can become huge structures, lined with grass or finer material. Normally lays a clutch of three eggs, white marked with chocolate and red-brown over grey undermarkings. The female is larger than the male, reaching 24 in (61 cm) in length.
