SELECTED BIRDS OF BRITAIN

TAWNY OWL

Strix aluco sylvatica

One of the most familiar owls in Great Britain. Not found in the outer islands. Lives in woodlands, parks and gardens; very often in highly populated, suburban localities. Nocturnal, rarely seen by day unless mobbed by smaller birds or otherwise disturbed from its roosting site in a tree. Feeds on small mammals, birds or insects. When hunting, the familiar cry is heard, one bird will call 'kewick', and another will answer 'hoo-hoo'. During courtship the male claps its wings. Nests in an old squirrel drey, a nest deserted by another bird, or most frequently in a hollow tree. Lays 2-4 rounded, off-white eggs. The sexes are identical in appearance and reach about 15 in (38 cm) in length.
