The specimen of "Allenburys" Milk Food, marked No. I, received here on 8/5/02, has been duly examined, and I have been instructed to forward the following Report thereon:—

We have examined an original tin of the "Allenburys" Milk Food, No. 1, and find it to be free from pathogenic organisms, and from lactic acid bacterla. The bacteria present are comparatively few in number, of a harmless nature, and are such as occur naturally in the air. The fluid produced by mixing I part of the sample submitted with 6 parts of water was found to contain only about 1/5000th of the number of bacteria commonly present in cow's milk as delivered in large towns."
