Iron Phosphate - 2 "
Nux Vomica Alkaloids
equal to Strychnine
Phosphate - $\frac{1}{16}$ th "
"Bynin," Liquid Malt 1 ounce

*Dose: 3ij to 3iv in water,
immediately before meals.*
