Method General Direction for External Use.

General Direction for External Use.
First cleanse the part with warm water and dry. Then apply a few drops of Olbas and firmly massage into the skin. Then cover with woollen material. Relief is speedy. This applies to small local applications, but is equally efficacious for larger areas, or even for the whole body. The first senation is of coolness, but this is followed by pleasant warmsth, and there usually follows profuse perspiration, the sign of Nature's strong response. Allow this to continue for an hour; then sponge quickly with warm water and wrap in dry blanket. Unlike other methods of inducing perspiration, this affects the heart's action very slightly, if at all.



Method Directions for Swallowing.

Add from three to six drops of Olbas to a small teaspoonful of pure honey or warm milk, or a dessertspoonful of hot water.

Method Directions for Bowel and Vaginal Irrigation

Add ten drops to the warm water immediately before using a 4 pint douche. This thoroughly disinfects the lower bowel and thus greatly assists recovery. The same applies to vaginal douche.

Method Directions for Treatment of Neuritis.

First well massage with warm olive oil. Then immediately after with Olbas.

Directions for Application to Inflamed Tonsils, Boils, Open Wounds, etc.

Apply one or two drops of Oibas to the part with a clean camels'-hair brush. In the case of open wounds, paint only close round the wound, but not on the exposed interior.

Method Gargling.

Add 3 - 4 drops of Olbas to a small glass of cold or tepid water. First swallow half of this, in small sips.
Use the remainder for gargling.

Method For Piles (External).

Seven drops of Olbas in § pint warm water. Into this dip clean piece of white cotton cloth. Wring out lightly and bathe piles for a few minutes, gently pressing the warm cloth to aching spot.
