'Sulfomyl' is packed in a convenient and simply operated dropper bottle. The rubber tip is removed and when the bottle is inverted a slight pressure on the centre of the rubber diaphragm releases one drop of the solution.

'Sulfomyl' is also available as a 2.5% water miscible ointment.

Packings: Eye drops, ½ oz. dropper bottle of 5% aqueous solution.
