HOLIDAYS AND THE BRITISH

You know your patients best, not as statistics, but as human beings. But how do they live when compared to the population as a whole? We thought you might be interested in some broad statistical facts about how people are living in Britain today. Let's look at the way they take their holidays.

Britain today. Let's look at the way they take their holidays.

A The majority of working Britons enjoy—or at least hope to enjoy—a fortnight's paid vacation per year, excluding public holidays. But a quarter of them stay firmly at home.

B Of the 35 million holidays that are taken, 30 million are spent in Britain, and 5 million abroad.

C Of those who stay within our coastlines, 20% go to the South-West, 15% to the South, while Scotland, Wales, and the North-West attract 12% each. Most holidaymakers prefer to travel by car—67% of them.

D Of those who venture further afield, 89% do not go beyond Europe. Most popular choices are Spain (24%), Italy (14%), France (13%), Republic of Ireland (10%), and Austria (7%). E Package-deal holidays abroad are growing in popularity: in 1960 only 30% of foreign holidays were 'pre-packed'. The latest figure is 50%.

Wherever and however they spend their holidays, the British spend £860 million a year in the effort to get away from it all.
