GAMBLING AND THE BRITISH

You know your patients best, not as statistics, but as human beings. But how do they live when compared to the population as a whole? We thought you might be interested in some broad statistical facts about how people are living in Britain today. Let's see where they place their bets.

- A Horses carry the largest proportion of the nation's hopes and shirts: annual turnover on horserace betting amounts to £885 million. Most punters, however, stay away from the racecourses, where the bookies' turnover is only £112 million, and the Tote £31 million.
- B The dogs carry another £225 million turnover, £69 million of which goes through the windows of the Tote. Another £50 million is gambled on other chance results—including tennis, boxing, and even elections!
- C Pools coupons carry £121 million worth of postal orders: the Government collect £37½ million in duty.
- D Gaming clubs between them turn over £675 million, bingo another £75 million, and 37,991 fruit machines turn over £35 million—nearly £1,000 a year each.

The total annual national gambling turnover, as estimated in 1968, amounted to the staggering sum of £2,066 million in a year.


