IODINE as an antiseptic

In this capacity the value of Iodine is well-known. Any scratch, cut, or abrasion may lead to infection unless measures be taken to cleanse the wound. The prompt application of Tincture of Iodine accomplishes this, and renders remote the risk of infection and consequent septic conditions.

Should dirt have entered the wound, it should preferably be washed with water before Tincture of Iodine is applied. If water is not available, apply Tincture of Iodine direct to the wound as a first-aid measure, and bandage until further treatment can be carried out.

Persistent bleeding or deep cuts should be treated by a medical practitioner.

IODINE for Swellings

When Tincture of Iodine is painted on the skin, the Iodine exercises an influence upon underlying tissues. Swollen or painful glands, chilblains, sprains, housemaid's knee, synovitis, and deep-seated inflammations often respond rapidly to treatment with Tincture of Iodine, which resolves and disperses the inflammatory conditions. The swelling slowly diminishes, and the tenderness is relieved after one or two applications.

Paint the skin over the site of the trouble with Tincture of Iodine once daily, or as directed by the medical attendant. The Tincture dries rapidly, and it is unnecessary to cover the place unless there is much tenderness. In such cases, cover with a thin layer of cotton wool, secured, if possible, by a lightly wound bandage.
