When sore throat prevents strenuous vocal effort it is time for a Strepsil. Strepsils are a valuable adjunct to the treatment of tonsillitis and pharyngitis, and bring quick relief to sore throats generally. Two special antiseptics in a slowly soluble base give sustained local bactericidal action against most of the common pathogens present in the mouth and throat. Strepsils contain neither local anaesthetic nor antibiotic, so problems of sensitisation or resistant organisms are unlikely.

Note: You don't **have** to be a Sporting Type to suck Strepsils they have a pleasant taste and are highly suitable for children and ordinary mortals.

Each Strepsil contains approximately 1.2 mg. 2:4-dichlorobenzyl alcohol and 0.6 mg. amyl-meta-cresol in an aromatic hard sugar base.
