B.D.H. SEX HORMONE PREPARATIONS IN CLINICAL PRACTICE

During the past decade there has been a considerable increase in knowledge of endocrine function, and the prescribing of endocrine products has become a normal procedure in general medical practice. The subject is complex, and, possibly, some physicians have hesitated to undertake to prescribe hormones and analogous substances, fearing that their knowledge of the subject was insufficient. Further, during the war years still more physicians have found it difficult to keep up to date with advances in methods of treatment with hormones; the enclosed booklet, therefore, should be of interest to both groups.

No attempt is made to cover the whole subject of sex hormones in treatment, but the established indications are briefly discussed from the point of view of the application of the B.D.H. Sex Hormone Preparations. The usual doses and methods of administration are summarised in a table on pages 8 to 13. More detailed information on the applications of each of the individual products will be gladly supplied on request.
