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PREFACE.

To the Education Authority
of the County of Dumbarton.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

I beg to submit the Sixteenth Annual Report on the Medical Inspection of School Children in the County, which has been compiled by the Medical Officers and also particulars relating to the work done at the Treatment Clinics.

Attention is directed to Table 7.-F, from which it will be seen that a County Standard of Heights and Weights has been worked out from data collected during the past years. It will be noted that the new County Standard, as far as heights are concerned, exceeds the Anthropometric Standard, while the County Standard of weights is for the most part lower than the Anthropometric Standard; indeed, as regards weights, in the case of both boys and girls of twelve years of age the standards differ by no less than 3 lbs.

The figures in the Report do not show any very marked difference from those of previous years. It will be seen, however, that fewer children suffering from ear diseases were discovered. The figures relating to tuberculous diseases are less than in previous years, but, on the other hand, the figures relating to Rickets show no improvement.

As regards treatment, the work in the Adenoid and Tonsil Clinics showed a slight increase, necessitating extra operating days in order to cope with the waiting list.

Owing probably to the prolonged absence, on account of illness, of both Miss Pugh and Miss M'Kendrick, the dental figures are not as large as in last year's Report.

I would again refer to the disadvantages under which treatment work in Kirkintilloch is carried out. The Clinic there cannot be said to be satisfactory, and it is to be hoped that a solution of the difficulty will soon be found. The matter was under consideration by the Committees during the year, but the difficulties which presented themselves had not been surmounted by the end of the School Year.

5.—Sanitary Condition of Schools.

The following improvements in the sanitary arrangements have been carried out during the year :—

At the following schools the old drinking wells have been replaced by modern drinking fountains :—St. Joseph's School, Helensburgh ; West Bridgend School, Dumbarton ; Garscadden Public School ; Elgin Street Public School, Clydebank ; Dalmuir Public School, Clydebank.

At Jamestown School and at Glen Douglas School the lavatory arrangements have been modernised.

Dalreoch R.C. School is now occupied, and the building includes ample and very modern lavatory accommodation.

Bonhill and Twechar Schools are now nearing completion, and, like Dalreoch, the lavatory arrangements are very modern.

In conjunction with the County Council, a Committee of the Authority has been considering the possibility of accidents to pupils in districts affected by the increased vehicular traffic. This is applicable, particularly to schools where the playground abuts the main roadway, and it has been considered expedient to erect barriers at the entrances to several play-grounds to prevent the children from running on to the road. Barriers will be erected at the following schools :—Bonhill, Jamestown, Lenzie Academy, Main Street, Alexandria.

The simpler method of fixing the gate in a half-open position has been considered sufficient prevention at the following schools, and the necessary bolt arrangements will be fixed on the gates :—Renton, Cardross, Roseneath, Rhu, Clyde Street, and Gavinburn.

At Bearsden Academy this question was very acute, and, as a result of negotiations with the County Council, the roadway has been widened to permit the forming of a footpath at the School side of the road. This alteration should be completed for the re-opening of the School after the Summer vacation.

6.—A, B, C, D, and E.—Organisation and Administration, etc., and Co-ordination with Public Health Departments.

For outline of organisation and administration see Reports 1914-15, pages 7-8 ; and 1922-23, pages 7-8.

Owing to the number of children on the waiting lists, the number of days allotted to operations for the removal of tonsils and adenoids had to be increased, and as an extra temporary nurse was required, Nurse Johnson, a former member of the staff, was appointed.

Nurse Johnson also took the place of Nurse Dougherty

and Nurse Lyle on the occasions when they were off duty on account of illness.

Miss M'Kendrick was off duty for a time on account of illness, and her place was taken by Mrs. Brown, M.B., L.D.S.

Mr. A. Hamilton Kirk, L.D.S., took over Miss Pugh's work during her absence on sick leave.

Dr. Tennant was granted a short leave of absence in order to attend post graduate classes in Vienna.

The Medical Officers have recently found the examination of subnormal and mentally defective children to be encroaching seriously on their time for routine work, so in order to relieve them of work of a purely educational nature, the Education Authority appointed Miss Annie T. Paterson, M.A., B.Ed., as adviser in such matters, part of Miss Paterson's duties being to report to the Medical Officers those children who do not appear to be suitable for the ordinary school.

Since her appointment in January, Miss Paterson has examined 76 children as to their mental condition, with the following result:—Fifty-five children were classified as definitely mentally defective and suitable for a special school; 10 children were found to be border-line cases; 4 children were over 13 years of age; and 7 children were institution cases.

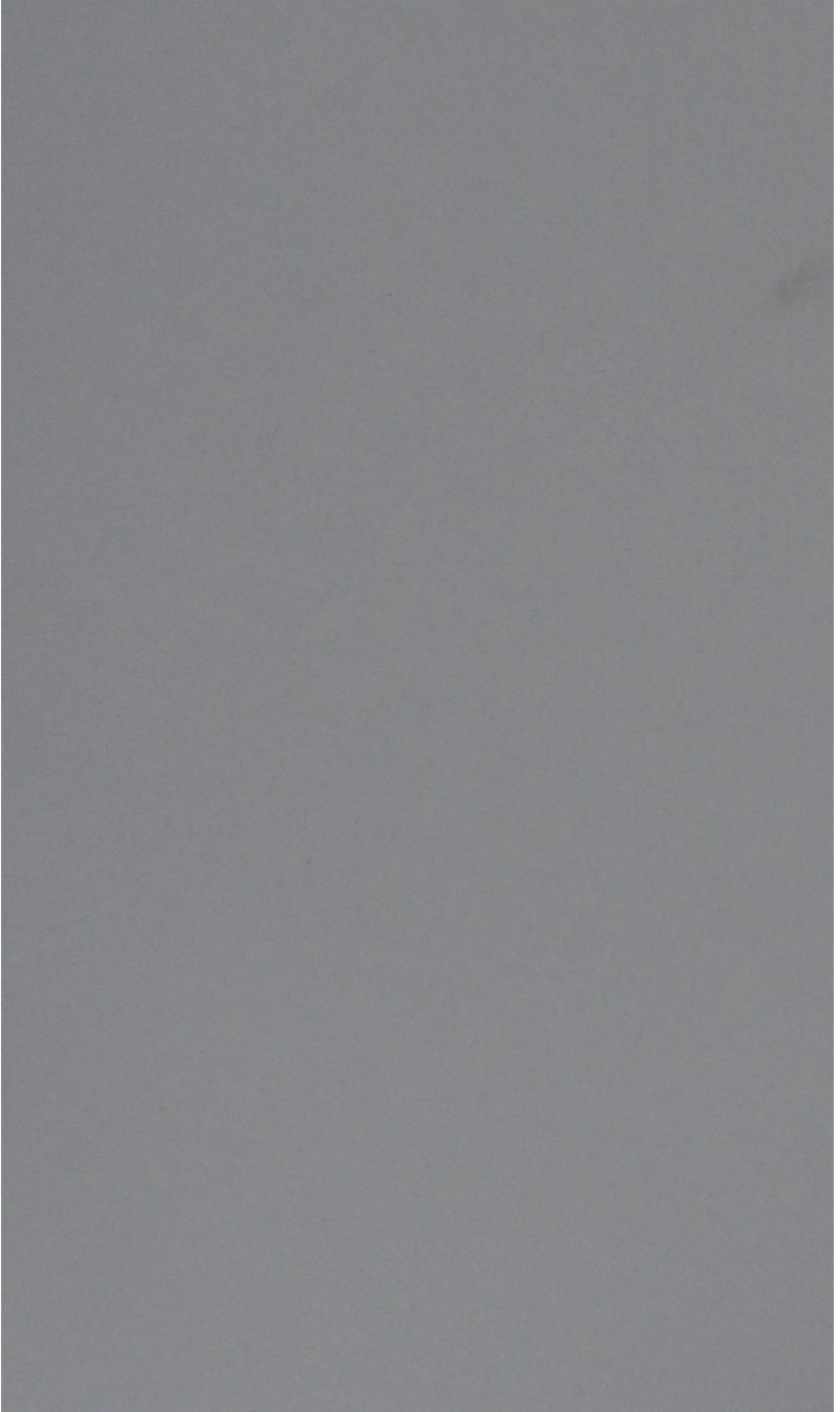

8.—Special Schools and Classes.

SPECIAL SCHOOLS.—There are three Special Schools in the County—Waverley Park Kirkintilloch; Milton School, Bowling; and High Street School, Dumbarton.

In Waverley Park Home, which is maintained by the West of Scotland Association for the Care of the Feeble-minded, there is one pupil from the county.

Milton Special School, which serves the Old Kilpatrick Area, has three classes for Mentally Defectives, with 58 on the roll; one class for Physically Defectives, with 15 on the roll; and one class for Deaf Mutes, with 7 on the roll—total 80.

High Street School, Dumbarton, which serves the Dumbarton and Vale of Leven Areas, has three classes for Mentally Defectives, with 53 on the roll; and two classes for Physically Defective children, with 30 on the roll—total 83.

SPECIAL CLASSES—(a) **FOR MENTALLY DEFECTIVE CHILDREN.**—Lairdsland School, Kirkintilloch, with 6 on the roll; Bearsden Academy, Bearsden, with 6 on the roll; James Street School, Helensburgh, with 11 on the roll.

(b) **FOR CONSERVATION OF VISION.**—Whitecrook School, Clydebank, with 24 on roll; College Street School in Dumbarton, with 20 on the roll.

9.—Arrangements for Physical Education and Personal Hygiene.

A. Physical Exercises. B. Baths. C. Practical Instruction in Hygiene.

There has been no change with regard to these. (See Reports 1914-15, p. 72; 1919-20, p. 41; 1920-21, p. 38.)

In Kirkintilloch the number of baths taken by School children from 20th June, 1926, to 19th June, 1927, was 2,505; 391 by girls and 2,114 by boys.

10.—Feeding of School Children.

CUMBERNAULD AREA.—There were no meals supplied during the session.

KIRKINTILLOCH AREA—(a) ADMINISTRATION.—The School Management Committee arranged with the lessee of a local restaurant to prepare and serve the meals to children on her own premises. (b) NATURE OF MEALS.—The meals consisted of cheese or meat paste sandwiches, with milk or cocoa. (c) NUMBER AND COST OF MEALS.—The number of meals supplied was 1,147, at a cost of 3½d. each. This sum covered all outlays.

NEW KILPATRICK AREA—(a) ADMINISTRATION.—Necessitous children were supplied at Garscadden School and Bearsden Academy with one meal per day. These cases were supplied after investigation by the Committee. (b) NATURE OF MEALS. Soup with bread, and pudding. (c) NUMBER AND COST OF MEALS.—Number 1047. Cost, 3½d. per meal. Of meals supplied 634 were paid by the Parish Council.

Old Kilpatrick, Dumbarton, and Vale of Leven Areas.—No meals were supplied.

HELENSBURGH AREA—(a) ADMINISTRATION.—There was a Soup Kitchen in Clyde Street School for twenty-three weeks (4th October, 1926, till 18th March, 1927), the financial loss on

which was borne by a voluntary fund. The total cost was £53 15s. 10d. The children paid one penny per meal, and from this source there was an income of £20 11s. 10d., leaving a deficit of £33 4s. to be met from the voluntary fund. The meals consisted of soup, or mince and potatoes, the children bringing their own bread. The number of meals supplied was 6,105, a daily average of 53.

Supply of Clothing, etc., to Necessitous Children.

In October, 1926, the Health Committee agreed that all certificates as to the condition of children attending school, and reported to the School Management Committees as requiring food, boots or clothing must be countersigned by the School Medical Officers.

This entailed a very considerable amount of extra work, which interfered considerably with the routine medical inspections.

It will be noted that there is a discrepancy between the numbers shown here and those on pages 11 and 12.

This is partly due to the fact that children are very often specially dressed for the routine examinations, and partly because the absence of boots during the Summer months is not recorded. There is also the fact that children are sometimes kept off school during the Winter months because of bad boots, want of boots, or insufficient clothing, and thus may escape routine examination.

X-Ray Treatment of Ringworm.

During the year 24 children were treated for Ringworm of the Scalp by X-Rays at Whitecrook Clinic. In all these cases the treatment was successful. There were other 17 children suffering from Ringworm of the Scalp who were either successfully treated by local medication or whose parents refused permission for X-Ray treatment. There were 16 cases of Ringworm of the body.
