LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

I now submit the Twenty-first Annual Report on the Medical Inspection of School Children in the County area which has been compiled by the Medical Officers.

The standard of cleanliness amongst the children has been on the whole well maintained, but it is of interest to note that the Medical Officers have observed that parents are tending to allow their children's hair to grow longer nowadays, and it is to be hoped that this is not the percursor of less cleanly conditions. When School Inspection commenced in 1911, with long hair in vogue, the percentage of dirty and verminous heads amongst girls was high, over 3%, this figure dropped to 0.3% on the average, but it has now risen to over 0.5%. The cult of the short hair was one of the most marked advances towards cleanliness in the past decades, and it is to be sincerely hoped that the fashion will not change to any extent.

As regards heights and weights the Medical Officers have revised the County standard by the inclusion of actual findings in recent years. The average figures used now are those of the eleven years—1919-20 to 1929-30; and the actual observations range from 13,000 in the entrant group to 769 in the 16 year

old group.

Comparing the findings of the year under review with this standard, it is found that the children were taller and heavier than the average of previous years in every group except one, in which the average weight is the same as the standard, the

height slightly exceeding it.

As far as nutrition is concerned the present day scholar does not show any marked deterioration when compared with the returns for 1930-31. The percentage "below average nutrition" this year is 10.2 as against 11.1 in 1930-31, and cases having "very bad nutrition" are .7% this year as against .9% in the previous year. This satisfactory condition is reflected in the school attendances. In spite of a somewhat severe epidemic of infectious disease the average attendance reached the figure of 89.4% which has only thrice been exceeded since 1919.

During the session the Medical Officers commenced observations on the conditions of children who had undergone

operations for the removal of Tonsils and Adenoids. It was not however, found possible in the time available to collect sufficient data on which to base any definite finding, but an improvement in health would appear to follow in the majority of cases.

It is satisfactory to record the increased interest taken by parents in the work of the routine examinations. In 1911. 1912 parents were present at only 3% of examinations, whilst

now the corresponding figure is 44.3%.

During 1932 the Orthopædic Clinics at Clydebank and Dumbarton were opened and work commenced there. The Clinic at Kirkintilloch which is to replace the present somewhat scattered accommodation was nearing completion at the end of the School session.

### 5.—SANITARY CONDITION OF SCHOOLS.

The policy of remodelling the lavatories has again been pursued, and during the year such improvements have been carried out at the undernoted schools:—

Kilcreggan P. School ... Boys' Lavatories.

This work entailed the removal of defective woodwork and the replacement of old and obsolete fittings by modern wash-down closets; and these installations have been found

very satisfactory.

A further replacement of obsolete drinking fountains has also taken place. The old Kennedy wells at the following schools have been dismantled and modern hygienic drinking fountains erected:—

St. Joseph's R.C. School, Helensburgh. College Street P. School, Dumbarton. St. Patrick's H.G. School, Dumbarton. Whitecrook P. School, Clydebank. Radnor Park P. School, Clydebank. The question of cross ventilation in several of the older school buildings still engages the attention of the Committee, and, during the summer vacation period, opening parts and hopper sashes have been fitted in the windows of various schools.

As in former years, a considerable amount of painter work has been done, and all outside lavatories, heating chambers, stores and outhouses have been limewashed.





#### 8.—Special Schools and Classes.

Special Schools.—There are three Special Schools in the County—Waverley Park, Kirkintilloch; Milton School, Bowling; and High Street School, Dumbarton.

In Waverley Park Home, which is maintained by the West of Scotland Association for the Care of the Feeble-minded, there is at present no pupil from the county.

Milton Special School, which serves the Old Kilpatrick Area, has three classes for Mentally Defectives, with 47 on the roll, one class for Physically Defectives with 12 on the roll, and two classes for Deaf Mutes, with 17 on the roll, a total of 76.

The pupils in the Deaf Mute classes at Milton are drawn from the whole county, except the parishes of Kirkintilloch and Cumbernauld.

High Street School, Dumbarton, which serves the Dumbarton and Vale of Leven Areas, has four classes for Mentally Defectives, with 59 on the roll, and two classes for Physically Defectives, with 34 on the roll, a total of 93.

Special Classes—(a) For Mentally Defective Chil-Dren.—Lairdsland School, Kirkintilloch, with 14 on the roll; Bearsden Academy, Bearsden, with 13 on the roll; Clyde Street School, Helensburgh, with 12 on the roll—total, 39.

(b) FOR CONSERVATION OF VISION.—Lairdsland School, Kirkintilloch, with 8 on the roll; Boquhanran School, Clydebank, with 36 on the roll; College Street School, Dumbarton, with 28 on the roll—total, 72.

Children for whom exemption from Physical Exercises or Baths was asked were examined by the School Medical Officers and exemption granted if sufficient reason was found. 11.—ARRANGEMENTS FOR MEDICAL TREATMENT See Annual Reports, 1927-28, pages 38, 39 and 40, and 1928-1929, pages 46 to 54.

On May 15th Miss Jean Masterton commenced duty in charge of Orthopædic Work. The treatment of deformities by medical gymnastics requires a considerable time to show results and the six weeks she was on duty was too short a time to achieve any great improvement in the cases she dealt with.

Miss Masterton worked three half-days per week in Dumbarton and three half-days per week in Clydebank.

## X-Ray Treatment of Ringworm.

Six cases of ringworm of the scalp were treated by X-Rays during the session. Two of these received only partial treatment. As all the cases were treated in the last fortnight of the session the results are not known at the time of writing.

## Ultra-Violet Light Treatment.

In Old Kilpatrick Area 9 children received treatment at Blawarthill Hospital, 4 of whom were still under treatment at the end of the session. Eight of these cases were children suffering from rickets and one was suffering from strumous ophthalmia. The total number of attendances was 209.

Vale of Leven Area—Fifteen children received treatment for various conditions, debility, bronchitis, adenitis, etc. The

total number of attendances was 455.

Helensburgh Area.—Four children received treatment, making 71 attendances.

# Special Report regarding Result of Ear, Nose and Throat Treatment.

Towards the end of the session an enquiry was made regarding the condition of children who had been treated for some ear, nose or throat condition. The children examined had been operated on from twelve to eighteen months before, and the number examined was 138. Of these, 57 were under eight years of age, 81 were eight years or over. Of the 57 children under eight years of age, the parents of 44 reported very definite improvement, 12 reported qualified improvement, and one stated that the child was no better. Of the 81 children over eight years of age, 64 were reported to be definitely improved, 12 expressed qualified improvement, and five were said to be no better.

Of the 17 children who still showed symptoms and the 6 children said to be no better, the chief symptoms persisting was a nasal catarrh, with general susceptibility to catarrh and colds. In most of these cases there was reason to doubt whether due attention had been paid to the instructions relative to nasal hygiene given after the operation.

It is proposed to carry on the investigation during the next session, examining each week the children operated on

in the corresponding week of the previous year.
