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To the County Council of the County of Dunbarton.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

I submit the Twenty-second Annual Report on the Medical Inspection and treatment of School Children in the County area. This report has been, as usual, compiled by the Medical Officers and is in accordance with the requirements of the Department of Health for Scotland.

The figures as revealed for the last school year are so very little different from those of the previous year that it is not necessary to call special attention to any of them. I would, however, direct attention to the continued enquiry which is being made by the Medical Officers into the results of the treatment by operation of enlarged Tonsils and Adenoids. It will be noted that, taken as a whole, the results are satisfactory although it is perhaps disappointing that quite a number of children have apparently not benefited to the extent which we had expected. One matter which is referred to might possibly receive further consideration, and that is the training of children who, owing to enlarged Adenoids and Tonsils, have developed mouth breathing. Classes might be formed in order to train such children to resume breathing naturally through their noses. The adoption of this might improve the results obtained.

Reference is made in the report to the opening of Kirkintilloch Clinic, and a photograph and plan have been included to enable those members who have not seen the premises to realise the advantages which the children of that area now possess.

Finally I would like to mention that the arrangements made with the Town Council of Dumbarton that a portion of the time of their Medical Officer of Health should be devoted to School Medical Inspection and Treatment, continues to work in a satisfactory manner.

5.—Sanitary Condition of Schools.

The question of remodelling lavatories has again received special consideration, and such improvements have been carried out at the undernoted schools:—

Rosneath Public. Knoxland Public. Our Holy Redeemer's R.C. Gartconner Public.

This work entailed the gutting out of defective woodwork and the replacement of the old and obsolete fittings by modern wash-down Closets, and these improvements are proving very satisfactory.

As in former years, the obsolete Kennedy Wells in quite a number of schools have been replaced by modern hygienic Drinking Fountains, and there are now very few school buildings which have still this old type of fitting.

New Sinks and Basins have been installed in the Cloakrooms of several schools throughout the year to replace obsolete or badly worn fittings.

The Water Supply to Lairdsland School was augmented, and the Hot Water in Whitecrook Clinic was extended to the bathroom.

The Ventilation in several of the older buildings has been improved by forming opening parts, and hopper sashes have been fitted on the windows at several buildings. The lavatories, heating chambers, stores and outhouses have been

limewashed as usual, and a considerable amount of painter work and washing down of walls has again been done.

6.—A, B, C, D, and E.—Organisation and Administration, etc., and Co-operation with Public Health Departments.





8.—Special Schools and Classes.

SPECIAL SCHOOLS.—There are three Special Schools in the County—Waverley Park, Kirkintilloch; Milton School, Bowling; and High Street School, Dumbarton.

In Waverley Park Home, which is maintained by the West of Scotland Association for the Care of the Feeble-minded, there is at present one pupil from the county.

Milton Special School, which serves the Old Kilpatrick Area, has three classes for Mentally Defectives, with 59 on the roll, one class for Physically Defectives with 14 on the roll, and two classes for Deaf Mutes, with 14 on the roll, a total of 87.

The pupils in the Deaf Mute classes at Milton are drawn from the whole county, except the parishes of Kirkintilloch and Cumbernauld.

High Street School, Dumbarton, which serves the Dumbarton and Vale of Leven Areas, has four classes for Mentally Defectives, with 62 on the roll, and two classes for Physically Defectives, with 38 on the roll, a total of 100.

Special Classes—(a) For Mentally Defective Chil-Dren.—Lairdsland School, Kirkintilloch, with 16 on the roll; Clyde Street School, Helensburgh, with 11 on the roll total, 27.

(b) For Conservation of Vision.—Lairdsland School, Kirkintilloch, with 7 on the roll; Whitecrook School, Clydebank, with 35 on the roll; College Street School, Dumbarton, with 27 on the roll—total, 69.

X-Ray Treatment of Ringworm.

Four cases of ringworm of the scalp were treated by X-Rays during the session. One of these received only partial treatment. As all the cases were treated during the last fortnight of the session the results are not known at the time of writing.

Ultra-Violet Light Treatment.

In Old Kilpatrick Area 5 children received treatment at Blawarthill Hospital. Four of these cases were children suffering from rickets and one was suffering from strumous ophthalmia. The total number of attendances was 120.

Vale of Leven Area.—Twenty-two children were treated

for various conditions, debility 7, bronchitis 5, adenitis 4, psoriasis 2, malnutrition 2, other conditions 2. The total number of attendances was 416 and improvement was recorded in the case of 16 patients.

Helensburgh Area.—Five children received treatment. The total number of attendances was 85, and improvement

was recorded in the case of three patients.

ORTHOPÆDIC TREATMENT.

The Orthopædic Clinics in Clydebank and Dumbarton, under the care of Miss Jean Masterton, were open during the whole session, while the Clinic in Kirkintilloch was opened in May, 1933. Until the opening of the Kirkintilloch Clinic, Miss Masterton worked three half-days per week in Clydebank and three half-days per week in Dumbarton. Now each clinic is open two half-days per week.

NEW CLINIC AT KIRKINTILLOCH.

For a considerable time it had been obvious that some new arrangement must be made in Kirkintilloch as regards clinic premises. Originally a certain amount of work had been done in the Nurses' Home and in various scattered School Clinics and latterly better accommodation was obtained in the Town Buildings. These premises, although an improvement on the former ones, were never really satisfactory, mainly on account of the small size of the Operating Room but also because the room used as a ward could only accommodate a very limited number of children overnight which made the Adenoid and Tonsil work uneconomical.

The Department of Health precipitated the building of a new Clinic by further limiting the number of children

to be dealt with at a time.

Before the 1929 Act came into force several plans had been prepared and sites inspected but some difficulty always arose, either as to the cost or as to the position of the site suggested. It was left therefore for the newly constituted County Council to carry out the scheme which had originated in the days of the Education Authority.

The buildings, which have accommodation for all forms of school inspection and treatment and also child welfare work, are shown on a plan on page 40 and were opened formally by the Rev. W. W. Reid, Convener of the Public Health Committee of the County (Provost Rutherford of Kirkintilloch


presiding), in November, 1932.




The building is of hollow brick construction and cement roughcast outside, with natural stone base course and dressings, sparingly used from Corsehill Quarry. The architect considered that to erect an iron railing along the entire frontage to Lenzie Road would be a very expensive item, and would also give to the building that institutional appearance of a less enlightened age, and designed a low parapet wall with stone coping, the gateways being marked with substantial brick built and roughcast piers; the gates are of wrought iron of simple design.

The entrance vestibule enters into a hall from which the staircase to the upper floor arises. The staircase is constructed with a solid balustrade designed on modern lines. To the left of the entrance hall is a room for the Medical Officer, with lavatory and store for drugs and appliances. This room is balanced on the other side by a room of similar size, also with lavatory and storage for the use of the nurses. Continuing down the left hand corridor, which is six feet wide, is a waiting






Medical Examination and Treatment Clinic, Kirkintilloch.

room for mothers who may accompany their children. A side entrance to this room is provided, adjacent to which is a

covered shelter for perambulators.

At the end of the corridor is the ophthalmic clinic, fitted with all necessary appliances. Adjoining this room is a general treatment clinic. This room is fitted with sinks for cleansing purposes and a large foot bath. A bathroom is attached to this room and dressing cubicles are provided

adjacent.

To the right of the entrance hall is an electrical treatment room. This apartment is equipped with an ultra-violet ray lamp of the latest pattern, and two arc lamps for general electrical treatment. It is cubicled off with hanging curtains, so that treatment can be carried on simultaneously with any of the electrical apparatus. Adjacent to this room is a range of spray baths and lavatory accommodation, and also curtained off cubicles forming dressing rooms. At the end of the corridor is the orthopaedic classroom of good size, having a southern and western exposure. It is fitted with the most modern appliances for corrective treatment. The spray baths, dressing cubicles and lavatory are of easy access from the classroom, forming a complete unit. A room has been provided adjoining the classroom wherein any plaster castings may be undertaken or special appliances stored. It is fitted with a sink. A cleaners' press and storage presses are pro-

vided on the ground floor.

The chief room on the upper floor is the operating theatre, the north wall of which is taken up by a large window worked with patent gearing. The floor is laid with composition material of a pleasant red colour. The equipment consists of operating table, operating hand lamp, surgeons' sinks, instrument case, and is up-to-date in every respect. A room for sterilising of instruments, leading out of the theatre, is provided. Adjoining the theatre and leading off a sub-corridor is a dressing or preparation room for children awaiting operation. A recovery ward for ten beds occupies the entire frontage of the centre outshoot of the building on the upper floor, and is adjacent to the operating theatre. The intention is to keep children who have been operated on for a night in this ward so as they can receive every attention, and in view of this a kitchen and nurses' bedroom have been provided. dental clinic is situated on the upper floor and adjacent to the ward room into which children can be moved for recovery. A ward sink room, lavatories for nurses and children and cleaners' room is also provided on the upper floor.

The building is heated throughout by a low pressure system of hot water, and hot water for domestic purposes is obtained from an independent system, with plant situated

in the heating chamber. Electricity is installed throughout and includes the usual lighting units, power units for heating, cooking and dental drilling. The decoration of the building internally has been carried out in a uniform scheme of bright sunlight colours, and all woodwork stained deep blue or silver colour.

The accepted tenders for the structure amounted to £4500, and furnishings, floor coverings and equipment will bring the cost up to £5500.

INQUIRY INTO RESULTS OF OPERATIONS FOR REMOVAL OF TONSILS AND OR ADENOIDS.

As was mentioned in the Annual Report for 1931-32 an enquiry was begun regarding the condition of children who had been operated on for throat, nose and ear conditions,

practically all removal of tonsils and/or adenoids.

The number of cases examined during the session 1931-32 was 138, and it was felt that this was insufficient to enable satisfactory conclusions to be drawn. During the session 1932-33 the inquiry was continued and 508 cases were examined. Adding this number to those examined in the previous session the total is 646 children. Of these 595 had tonsils and adenoids removed; 2 had only tonsils removed; 48 had only adenoids removed, and one child was operated on for removal of a Nasa Polypus.

The interval between the operation and the re-examination of the child was never less than 12 months and was some-

times as long as 18 months.

No selection of the cases was made except that children in rural areas who had long distances to come were not reexamined. In almost every case a parent was present at the re-examination.

The cases were classified into three groups—Result satisfactory, result moderately satisfactory, result unsatisfactory—the criterion being the effect on the general health of the child, based on the statement of the parent, the observation of the school medical officer, the disappearance of symptoms, and any other available evidence such as effect on school attendance.

Of those operated on for the removal of tonsils and adenoids, 79.5% were classified as result satisfactory, 12.4% as result moderately satisfactory, and 8.1% as result unsatisfactory.

Of those operated on for the removal of adenoids only, 50.0% were classified as result satisfactory, 22.9% as result moderately satisfactory, and 27.1% as result unsatisfactory.

The discrepancy in satisfactory results in the two groups

is worth noting, but as the number in the adenoids only group is so small it would be unjustifiable to attach undue

importance to the difference.

Undoubtedly the most striking result revealed by the enquiry was the marked improvement in general health, even in cases where individual symptoms such as discharges from nose or ears showed little change.

It is no exaggeration to say that many of the parents were enthusiastic about the beneficial effects of the operation

On page 44 will be found a table showing the results as

regards individual symptoms.

It will be seen that the great majority of cases of mouthbreathing are cured. Undoubtedly many of the cases in which mouth-breathing persists after the operation are due to the lack of training in nose-breathing. In three cases mouthbreathing began only after the operation, but no satisfactory reason was found for this.

The number of cases in which deafness was a symptom before operation was 124, and of these, 81 were cured and 43 stated that there was little or no improvement. Six cases developed deafness after the operation, but nearly all were due to wax in the ear and were dealt with.

Of the 94 children who had discharging ears prior to operation, 50, or a little more than half, benefited by the operation so far as this symptom was concerned, and of those with discharging nose, 92 out of 176 reported as being cured. On the other hand, 8 children complained of running ear appearing for the first time after operation, and no fewer than 17 complained of persistent nasal discharge appearing for the first time after operation. Some of the cases of persistent nasal discharge are due to neglect of the toilet of the nose, but these are a minority.

A history of undue susceptibility to colds, either in head or chest, prior to the operation was given in 287 cases. Of these 167 were definitely improved by the operation, while 120 reported no change in susceptibility. Six patients complained that the operation had increased the susceptibility to cold.

Of the 117 pupils with a history of enlarged glands before operation, 64 were found to be cured and 53 had still some enlargement. Two children developed enlarged glands after the operation, but in these cases the condition of the teeth was sufficient to account for the onset.

Of the 31 cases who had a history of rheumatism before the operation, only 7 reported no further attack, while 24 reported no change. The removal of tonsils and/or adenoids seems to have no effect where the rheumatism or chorea is established. No fewer than 8 cases had rheumatism for the first time after operation.

It is proposed to continue the enquiry next session.
