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PREFACE.

*To the County Council
of the County of Dunbarton.*

Ladies and Gentlemen,

I herewith submit the Twenty-seventh Annual Report on the Medical Inspection and Treatment of School Children, which has been compiled by the School Medical Officers.

Taken generally, the figures in the various Tables show very little difference from those of the previous year.

During the year a start was made with a Scheme for Orthoptic Treatment and three clinics were established for this purpose under the supervision of the School Oculist, Dr. Tennent, and Miss Marsh, a qualified Orthoptist. The treatment of squint requires considerable patience on the part of both teacher and patient and it is hoped that both parents and children will realise that improvement or cure is only obtained by attention to instructions and perseverance with the ocular exercises prescribed. It is, of course, too early to give any definite report on individual patients.

A census of children suffering from crippling conditions, including minor spinal curvature, was undertaken in the early part of the year at the request of those who are administering the Fund set aside for Scotland by Lord Nuffield.

It is hoped that some Scheme for dealing with patients of all ages suffering from such conditions will shortly be evolved. At present our own Orthopaedic Clinics are doing good work amongst school and pre-school children and, should a National Scheme be arranged for, the clinics will be of great value in dealing with cases not requiring Hospital treatment.

An enquiry into the prevalence of speech defects was made during 1938, and it was discovered that the problem is a bigger one than was anticipated. Taking the County as a whole, it was found that upwards of 200 children had either noticeable defects in articulation or were actual stammerers. There is no doubt that this matter requires further consideration with a view to the institution of remedial classes.

During the year we were unfortunate in losing the services of Mr. Martin, L.D.S., who for 17 years had been one of our School Dentists. His appointment as Chief Dental Officer for the Cumberland County Council was, however, well deserved.

5.—Sanitary Condition of Schools.

The following notes have been supplied by the County Architect's Department.

During the Financial Year ending in May, 1938, several improvements were again carried out at schools within this County.

The larger work included the complete modernising of the boys' lavatories at Main Street Public School, Alexandria ; Renton Public School and Drumchapel Public School (since taken over by Glasgow under the last boundaries' extension). In each case the offices were completely gutted, re-arranged, and equipped with modern wash-down closets.

At Bonhill Public School, Knoxland Public School, Milngavie Public School and Our Holy Redeemer's R.C. School the greater part of the wood-work was renewed, and the existing sanitary fittings generally overhauled and put into good condition.

The usual replacement of defective and broken W.C. pans was also carried out during the summer vacation period, and it can be stated with all safety that the school lavatories in this County are in a very good state of repair and cleanliness.

The old Kennedy drinking wells have now been done away with at all of our schools, and have been replaced by the modern type of drinking fountain which is proving very satisfactory.

The Property Committee, as in former years, approved of the usual expenditure on washing of classroom walls, painting, limewashing, etc., work, and the policy of improving the cross ventilation of classrooms was carried a step further when opening parts were formed in the windows of classrooms at various schools.

6.—A, B, C, D, and E.—Organisation and Administration, etc., and Co-operation with Public Health Departments.

The scheme for administration is fully described in the 1928-29 Report, pages 44-54, and 1930-31 Report, pages 7 and 8.

Mr. Martin resigned in September, 1937, and Dr. Pollock was appointed in his place.

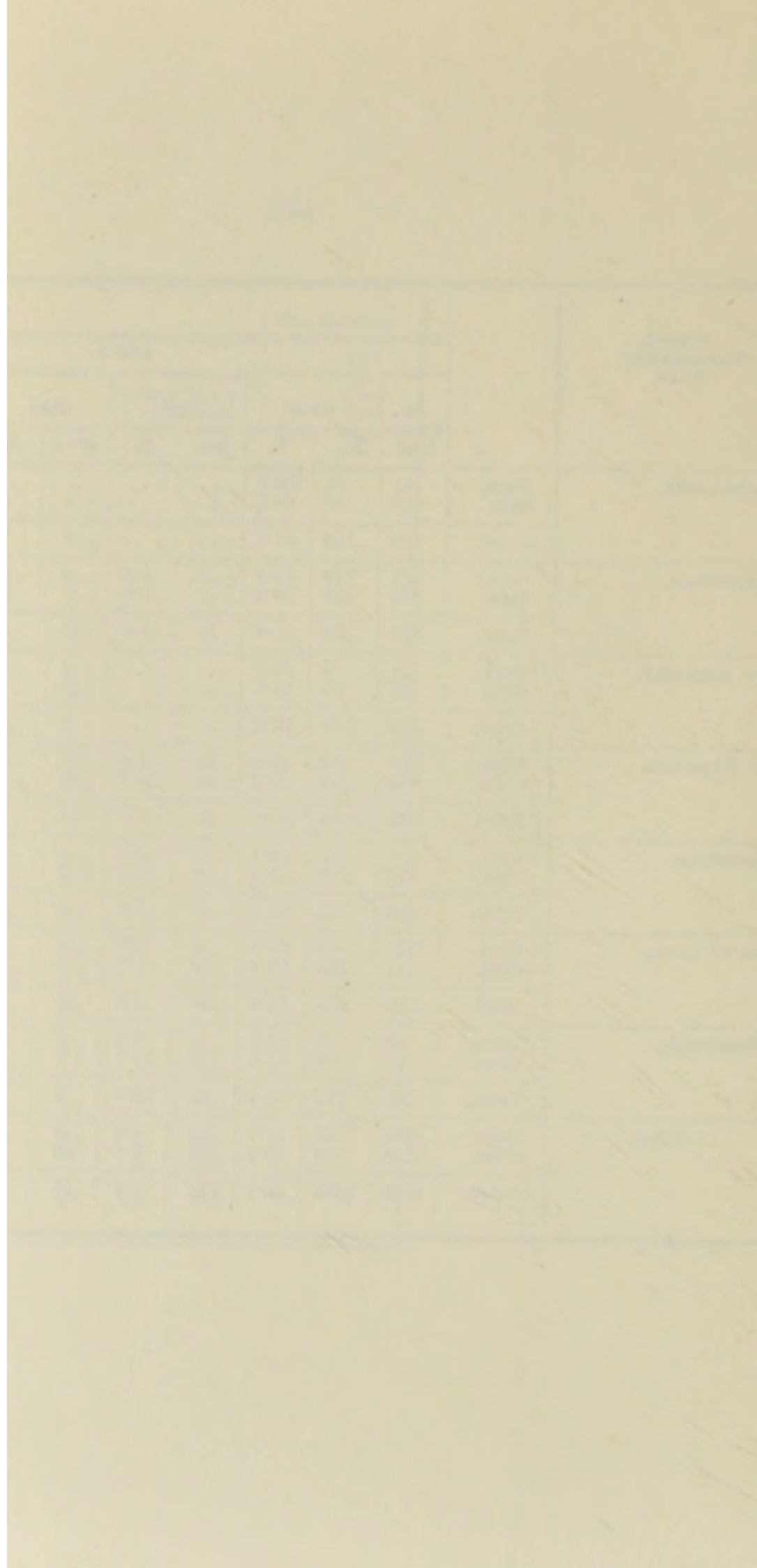

8.—Special Schools and Classes.

Special Schools—There are three Special Schools in the County—Waverley Park Home, Kirkintilloch ; Milton School, Bowling ; and High Street School, Dumbarton.

In Waverley Park Home, which is maintained by the West of Scotland Association for the Care of the Feeble-minded, there is at present no pupil from the County.

Milton Special School, which serves the Old Kilpatrick Area, has three classes for Mentally Defectives, with 52 on the roll, one class for Physically Defectives with 8 on the roll, and two classes for Deaf Mutes, with 17 on the roll, a total of 77.

The pupils in the Deaf Mute classes at Milton are drawn from the whole county, except the parishes of Kirkintilloch and Cumbernauld.

High Street School, Dumbarton, which serves the Dumbarton Vale of Leven Areas and Helensburgh Areas, has three classes for Mentally Defectives, with 52 on the roll, and two classes for Physically Defectives, with 25 on the roll, a total of 77.

Special Classes—(a) *For Mentally Defective Children*—Lairdsland School, Kirkintilloch, with 24 on the roll (two classes).

(b) *For Conservation of Vision*.—Lairdsland School, Kirkintilloch, with 8 on the roll ; Whitecrook School, Clydebank, with 17 on the roll, College Street School, Dumbarton, with 21 on the roll. Total 46.

Medical Inspection.—All the children attending Special Schools were medically examined during the session, as has been done each year for some time past. During the present session 136 children—71 boys and 65 girls—were examined. Of these, 83 were mentally defective and 53 physically defective. Fifty-four of these children were classed as having nutrition below average, while twelve had very bad nutrition. Fifteen showed evidence of ear, nose or throat disease, twenty had defective eyesight, while thirty-eight showed physical deformities, congenital or acquired.

9.—Arrangements for Physical Education and Personal Hygiene.

A. Physical Exercises. The arrangements for these remain much the same as in former years. (See Annual Reports, 1914-15, page 72 ; 1919-20, page 41 ; 1920-21, page 38 ; and 1927-28, page 37).

Children for whom exemption from Physical Exercises or Baths was asked were examined by the School Medical Officers and exemption was granted if sufficient reason were found. In addition to these a number of children who were found by the School Medical Officers in the course of routine examination to be suffering from such physical defect as demanded exemption from drill or baths were exempted.

Cases kept under Special Observation for Heart Weakness and Other Causes.

During the session 419 cases were kept under special observation because they had defective hearts or some condition frequently associated with cardiac disease. Of this number, 179 were boys and 240 girls. Those with cardiac disease numbered 242 (102 boys and 140 girls), but only 113 children (49 boys and 64 girls) had any symptoms. The commonest symptom was breathlessness, but undue lassitude and pallor also occurred fairly frequently. The remainder seemed quite well and the heart condition was found only on examination. In 46 cases the defect seemed to be congenital, and in 196 cases acquired. Of the congenital cases 22 were boys and 24 were girls ; of the acquired cases 80 were boys and 116 were girls. The heart condition in 34 cases was attributed to Rheumatism or Rheumatic Fever alone ; in 17 cases to Rheumatism and Scarlet Fever ; in 58 cases to Scarlet Fever alone ; in 12 cases to Scarlet Fever and Diphtheria ; in 25 cases to Diphtheria ; in 11 cases to Chorea ; in 14 cases to Pneumonia and other causes ; and in 25 cases there was no ascertainable cause.

In only 74 cases was a satisfactory family history obtained, and in 25 of these a history of cardiac or rheumatic disease was got ; the other 49 were definitely negative.

Of the cases other than cardiac disease kept under observation 28 (15 boys and 13 girls) were either suffering from Chorea, or more commonly, had had it recently. There were also 6 boys and 12 girls kept under observation for other reasons such as recent Scarlet Fever, general ill health, etc.

10.—Feeding of School Children.

In the Vale of Leven Area eight children were granted a supply of milk, one pint daily, for periods varying from two to five months. In other Areas no milk was granted and no free meals supplied.

Milk-in-Schools Scheme.

I am indebted to the Director of Education for the following details in connection with the Milk-in-Schools Scheme.

The Milk-in-Schools Scheme was introduced into Schools in this County (except in seven rural schools) in April, 1935. Since that date, however, the Scheme has been introduced into Arrochar School.

The milk supplied to schools under the Scheme is Grade "A" T.T. except in two schools in outlying districts—Garelochhead and Rosneath Schools—which are supplied with ordinary milk; the source of supply being approved by the County Medical Officer.

No pupils were supplied with milk under this Scheme on certificate of School Management Committees, i.e., that the child had been recommended for milk by the School Medical Officer and the parent was in necessitous circumstances.

Up to date the Special Schools and Classes have not participated in the Milk-in-Schools Scheme, the Committee taking the view that as the pupils in such schools are supplied with meals there is no need for an additional ration of milk being supplied in such cases.

Employment of Children.

Permits under the Children and Young Persons (Scotland) Act, 1932, are now issued by the School Management Committees. New Bye-Laws came into operation during the Session 1933-34. The numbers of children examined by the Medical Inspectors during the year were as follows :—

Admission of Children to Approved Schools.

During the session 15 children were examined with special regard to their suitability, physically and mentally, for admission to Approved Schools. Of these 14 were committed by the Sheriff to institutions.

X-Ray Treatment of Ringworm.

No cases of Ringworm of the scalp were treated by X-Ray epilation during the session.

Ultra-Violet Light Treatment.

In Old Kilpatrick Area (Duntocher Clinic), 20 school children were treated, 1 for bronchitis, 3 for debility, 5 for malnutrition, 1 for alopecia areata, and 10 for glands. The total number of attendances was 672 and an improvement was noted in 18 cases.

In the Vale of Leven Area 30 school children were treated, 5 for debility, 10 for bronchial conditions, 4 for glands, three for skin conditions, 3 for rheumatism and 5 for other conditions. The total number of attendances was 836, and an improvement was noted in 21 cases.

In Kirkintilloch Area 23 school children were treated, 2 for bronchitis, 16 for debility, 1 for anaemia, 1 for skin condition, 3 for glands. The total number of attendances was 406, and an improvement was noted in 23 cases.

In Dumbarton Area 29 children were treated ; 5 for asthma, 3 for malnutrition, 5 for bronchitis, 4 for adenitis, 2 for general debility, 4 for septic conditions, 1 for Otitis, 1 for alopecia areata, and 4 for convalescence. The total number of attendances made was 627 and an improvement was recorded in 26 cases.

ORTHOPAEDIC TREATMENT.

The Orthopaedic Clinics in Clydebank, Kirkintilloch, and Dumbarton, under the care of Miss Morag Galloway, were in full working order during the session, each clinic being open two whole days per week.
