Aims and objectives

- To enable people living with HIV / AIDS to make informed choices about their health
- To enable health professionals in the African Voluntary sector (Advocacy workers, Treatments information worker, Health advisors, etc) to provide accurate and up-to-date treatments information / advise to people living with HIV and AIDS
- To empower people living with HIV and AIDS to take charge of their health by putting health at the top of their priorities
- To promote a 'reading culture' in the African communities and not to rely only on word of mouth
- To provide peer education and support.



Activity format

Activity format

- The Peer Education worker will run a monthly Treatments Exchange Forum.
- The Exchange Forum will provide the opportunity to share and exchange information and experiences
- There will be regular update on new developments in research and on other topical issues like: side effects, combination therapy, resistance, salvage therapy, HIV and pregnancy, etc. These will be provided by clinicians and other experts
- The Forum will discuss health related issues in the African communities and how to overcome them
- Workshops and videos, and presentations.
