#### **ALCOHOL, DRUGS & HIV**

The use of alcohol and, increasingly, of illicit drugs are widespread in Western Europe. This use is accompanied by a tragic toll of accidents, illnesses, premature deaths, social, occupational, economic and public order problems. It is now a decade since the HIV/AIDS epidemic was recognized. In Ireland, the United Kingdom and in many other countries, rates of HIV/AIDS continue to increase relentlessly. Worldwide, HIV/AIDS is mainly associated with heterosexual infection. In some localities, such as Dublin and Edinburgh, intravenous drug use has been an important factor in the spread of HIV/AIDS. In addition, unprotected sex appears to be associated with heavy drinking and the use of non-injected drugs.

An international conference will be held on the 27th and 28th May 1993, at the Burlington Hotel, Dublin. This event is designed to highlight key issues, to foster debate about the use of alcohol and illicit drugs, their associated problems and the management of these problems. This meeting is also intended to focus attention on the growing problems of HIV/AIDS, to examine evidence on the pattern of this global epidemic and to outline strategies to curb infection. If present trends continue, over 100 million people will be HIV infected by the end of the century.

These issues will be debated and discussed by clinicians, researchers and workers in alcohol, drugs and HIV/AIDS agencies as well as by educationalists, trade union representatives, employers and policy makers. This conference will be of interest to anyone concerned with issues related to alcohol, illicit drugs or HIV/AIDS.

Sections of the Irish "Names Quilt" will be on display at the conference. These embroidered panels are part of an international memorial to people who have died of AIDS related causes.

#### HOTEL ACCOMODATION

Conference accomodation has been arranged at two attractive hotels within walking distance of the venue. These are as follows :-
