A condom should be used in heterosexual sex for both vaginal and anal sex (for anal sex a stronger condom should be used) preferably one which contains Nonoxynol 9 as a safeguard. All lubricants used with condoms must be water based (KY, but preferably Gynol II as this contains Nonoxynol 9). Grease based lubricants (Vaseline etc.) rapidly damage the rubber and so reduces the protection.

Any sex not involving penetration or the exchange of body fluids is safe.
