How HIV transmission works; HIV Status

Everybody has an HIV status. If you've been infected with HIV, you are HIV positive. If not, you are HIV negative.

So long as two men are HIV negative, it is impossible for them to pass the virus to each other through sex.

Many men don't know that they have HIV. Just because someone hasn't told you they have HIV, it doesn't mean they're HIV negative.
