## What is HIV?

HIV is the virus that can lead to AIDS. You cannot normally tell if someone has the HIV infection, but whether a person is well or unwell, they can pass the virus on. Anybody can be potentially at risk from HIV. It's what you do that matters, not who you are.

The major ways HIV can be transmitted are through:

- Vaginal or anal sex without a condom (the exchange of bodily fluids).
- · Through infected blood.
- · By sharing needles and syringes.
- From an infected mother to her baby during or after pregnancy.

HIV is NOT transmitted through sharing crockery/cutlery, toilet seats, towels, swimming pools, kissing, mosquito bites and shaking hands. There is no risk of infection from everyday social contact.

Some countries have introduced HIV testing for visitors, and some refuse entry to people who are HIV antibody positive. The requirements for each country can be checked with the relevant Embassy or High Commission.


# safe SUN, safe FUN
