Sexual expression is an important part of a healthy gay life. With HIV and other sexually transmitted infections (STIs) there can be risks involved in sexual activity. The main risk of HIV is from sharing needles/syringes for drug use, or unprotected anal or vaginal intercourse (fucking or being fucked without a condom). There are many ways you can have full sex life and also reduce the risks of HIV. We find sexual pleasure in many different activities.

The Play Safe Play Sexy cards uses fantasy situations to encourage men who have sex with men to choose safer and sexy ways to express lust and love for each other. Remember STIs are easier to transmit than HIV and activities that are considered safe or low risk for HIV, may present higher risks for other STIs.

For safe sex always use a condom to reduce the risk from oral and anal and vaginal sex.
