"Condoms stop me cumming..."

"It's no joke. I spend hours pumping away, all turned on, but I can't cum. Usually I prefer not to fuck rather than go through the embarrassment and frustration of trying to cum in a rubber. But sometimes - like last night - I meet a guy who's determined to get fucked. I knew I shouldn't, but I thought I'd just put it in a bit and stop before I came. But once I'd started I just couldn't stop. I've been feeling pissed off with myself ever since. It's not my fault. I want to use condoms...I just can't."

Rubberstuffers packs contain extra-strong condoms that are normally recommended for gay sex. But if these stop you cumming, you might be happier with a thinner, standard strength condom. As they're not extra-strong and may be more likely to break, use LOADS of water-based lubricant and check the condom during fucking.

Other tips:

- fuck with a condom, but pull out and wank off when you want to cum

- while you're fucking with a condom, pull out every couple of minutes and wank until you almost cum, then fuck again

- fuck using a Femidom (female condom). These seem to be a good barrier that should prevent HIV transmission.
