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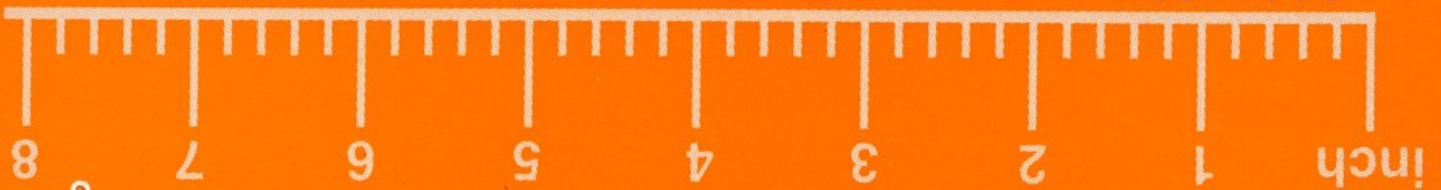
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"Condoms are too small..."



"Really, it's no joke. It's a miracle to stretch one over my knob, and then it's really uncomfortable. Usually I just don't fuck rather than go through the hassle of trying to get a rubber on. But sometimes - like last night - I meet a guy who's determined to get fucked. I knew I shouldn't, but I thought I'd just put it in a bit and stop before I came. But once I'd started I just couldn't stop. I've been feeling pissed off with myself ever since. It's not my fault. I want to use condoms...I just can't."



Rubberstuffers packs contain extra-strong condoms that are normally recommended for gay sex. They should fit most men without problems. But if they don't, you might be happier with a standard strength condom that is larger than average. Options available from mail-order companies include *Trojan Magnum*, *Trojan-Enz Large* or *Mondos XXL*. As they are not extra-strong and may be more likely to break, use **LOADS** of water-based lubricant and check the condom during fucking.

Some gay men fuck using Femidoms (female condoms). These seem to be a good barrier that should prevent HIV transmission.

Rubberstuffers will carry on lobbying condom manufacturers to make condoms in a size and shape that fits you, and for proper testing of the Femidom for gay men!
