Contents

There are two main parts to the pack:

1 Background text for health educators working with young people. This contains guidance about contexts within which AIDS education with young people can take place; the steps that need to be taken to prepare the ground for AIDS education with young people; information about young people, their lives, their beliefs, their needs; information about the social, medical and scientific aspects of HIV infection and AIDS; and guidance on the evaluation of AIDS education with young people.

2. Exercises which provide opportunities for young people to involve themselves in group work, simulations, games and role play around issues to do with HIV infection and AIDS. These exercises are constructed in modular form so as to address the needs of young people of different backgrounds and abilities.

Guidance is provided on how the exercises can be used. The pack also contains a bibliography, videography and resource list.
