Nancy's early work in the theatre included seasons at 'Stratford-on - Avon and the Old Vic, with Sybil Thorndike, Laurence Olivier and Ralph Richardson. She toured the Far East with Sir John Gielgud, and played Charmian at the Piccadilly Theatre in "Antony and Cleopatra" with Dame Edith Evans. Leaving the London stage to marry Commander Hoyes-Cock, Nancy lived in Assam for several years, where she reared three children.

On her return to the theatre, she played Assumta in 'The Aspern Papers' with Michael Redgrave and Flora Robson. She divided her time between broadcasting, television, theatre, films and film dubbing-as well as teaching handicapped children- and was the dialogue coach for Zeffirelli's "Jesus of Nazareth".

Her most recent plays were "Stepping Out" at the Duke of York's theatre, followed by a tour, and then a European tour of "The Importance of Being Earnest" playing Lady Bracknell.

Recent television productions include, "Never The Twain" with Donald Sinden, "A Slight Hitch" with Nigel Havers and Margaret in the last series of "French Fields"

Nancy has just completed filming "Maria's Child" a BBC TV drama, in which she plays Louisa, the Italian Grandmother. This will be shown early next year.
