

About London Lighthouse

Established in 1986 as a centre for all people affected by HIV and AIDS, London Lighthouse's prize-winning conversion of the old Solomon Wolfson School in London's North Kensington was opened by Her Royal Highness Princess Margaret in November 1988.

A 23 bed Residential Unit provides respite, convalescent, and terminal care, and the Day Care Programme is always fully subscribed. London Lighthouse offers a wide range of complementary and creative therapies alongside traditional medical treatment, as well as counselling and support groups. 1,500-2,000 people use Lighthouse's facilities every week. The Home Support Service provides assistance for people with AIDS unable to manage entirely on their own at home. There are several services exclusively for women, and London Lighthouse was awarded a 1991 National Training Award by the Department of Employment as well as receiving a Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors' Commendation for Urban Renewal.




