


FACTS was formed in the 1980's with the vision of bringing together the best available care for people living with HIV and AIDS. A key objective is the provision of training and education for General Practitioners and others working in the field.



The multi-disciplinary team responds to identified training needs and can organise tailor-made programmes for particular groups.

Members of the team are available to assist you with your own inhouse training. The team is experienced in various forms of training and will be happy to discuss your requirements.



A range of different training formats are available, determined by the issues addressed.

### These include:

- Lunchtime for Professionals. A meeting open to healthcare professionals.
- Evening seminar programme. A series of six weekly seminars held regularly (PGEA approved).
- HIV training for GP trainees. Half-day seminars for GP vocational trainees.
- In-Practice Training. Interactive training using a multidisciplinary approach, taking place in the practice.
   It is targetted at all members of the primary healthcare team.
- Shared care between GPs.
   A service available to GPs to provide support in the care of their patients with HIV/AIDS, and further their knowledge and understanding of HIV disease.
- In addition, custom-made training is organised for other groups, on request.
