WHAT CARA OFFERS

24 HOUR PASTORAL CARE

Our experienced and trained Pastors are on call to assist and support in times of crisis and emergency, especially in situations of sudden illness, bereavement, or other times of crisis. They can be contacted at the Basement, or by ringing the CARA Answerphone on 071 792 8299.

COMPLEMENTARY THERAPIES

At the Basement we offer a range of Complementary Therapies as part of our overall Pastoral Care service. These therapies include, massage, osteopathy, reflexology, art therapy and spiritual healing. Other forms of therapy are available too, and help people towards living well, whatever their circumstances.

FUNERAL AND BEREAVEMENT

Whether experiencing the death of a loved-one, or making preparations for your own death and funeral service, CARA Pastors can help support you. We are able to help you cope, help you find the right support, and help to ensure that funerals are what you want them to be.

TRAINING COURSES

Training work is important at CARA. Eveyone involved in providing services at CARA takes personal development seriously. We offer Ministry Training and other training opportunities regularly throughout the year, in London and Nationwide.

DROP-IN

The CARA Basement is open during office hours, staffed by welcoming volunteers. You can call in for a coffee and a chat, make bookings for Complementary Therapies, or arrange to see one on the Pastors.

Pastors are available in emergency 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

On Tuesdays there is a Drop-in Lunch every week.

VISITING SERVICE

Our trained Pastors can be asked to visit at home, in hospital or respite care facilities. We will connect you with a trained Pastor as near to you location as possible, wherever you might be.

COUNSELLING SERVICE

CARA offers some specialist and trained counsellors to those people at CARA who feel they need some confidential place to talk. Our therapists are from different backgrounds, and after some initial discussions, counselling can be arranged. We offer counselling as part of our overall Pastoral Care service.

VOLUNTEERS

CARA is a community, and we rely heavily on the volunteers who offer their time and skills to provide the servcies which are available. Some of the volunteers are themselves service users, and are represented at all levels of the management of CARA. This keeps what we are doing close to what you need.

CARA SUNDAY

One Sunday each month there is a lunch and social gathering, which takes place either at the Basement and Garden, or at a private home in Chiswick. These lunches are a time for making friends, and becoming more of a part of the CARA Family. People of all ages and backgrounds will be there.

A NATIONWIDE NETWORK

Though based in London, there are many people nationwide who are part of the CARA Network. We try to support people appropriately wherever they are by using this network of suitable people. We also try to share our experience with others who might wish to start their own local HIV/AIDS Project.

A SAFE PLACE

Everyone at CARA aims to offer non-judgmental personal, spiritual, pastoral support. We have clear policies about Equal Opportunities and Confidentiality. We do our utmost to make CARA a safe place, and a place which is personal.

CARING FOR THE CARERS

Because CARA offers support to anyone affected by HIV/AIDS, whether directly or indirectly, part of our work is to support those who are caring for others. We do this through our Pastoral work, our other Basement Services, and our Training activities.
