Who is the scheme for?

People aged at least 16 years old who are living with HIV/AIDS in the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea and who need a supportive environment for a weekend, a few weeks, several months or even as a permanent home. This may be to give their partners or families a break, for a convalescent period or while they are awaiting accommodation.

Who can become a carer?

Individuals, couples or families who live in, or within easy reach of the Royal Borough. You do not need any previous experience, but some understanding of HIV/AIDS and how it can effect people's lives would be very useful. In addition, flexibility and the ability to provide a caring and supportive environment are essential.

You may own your own home, be a council or a private tenant who can offer a spare room; or be a landlord/lady who can offer a bedsit/flat.



What do we offer?

- *Regular personal support and training for Carers.*
- *Regular support groups for Carers to get together.*
- *Social work and other necessary support for each person placed.*
- *Careful vetting and matching.*
- *Planned breaks from caring.*
