If you think you may have genital problems, such as a sexually transmitted disease (VD), or are concerned about HIV/AIDS, we can help at the Lloyd Clinic, Guy's Hospital (near London Bridge Stations). You will be seen in friendly surroundings by our helpful and professional staff.

You can find us at the entrance of the ground floor of the Outpatients Department. The Clinic is open every day, Monday to Friday, and you can make an appointment by phoning:-

You do not require a letter from your doctor, and the service is completely confidential and free of charge.

Patients are usually seen by appointment as this reduces the time you spend in the clinic.

The Lloyd Clinic is run by specialists in Genito-Urinary Medicine.

You will be seen and examined by a doctor, and tests will be performed as necessary to exclude sexually transmitted conditions, including HIV, if you wish.

Some tests are processed in our own laboratory, and the results of these are available during your visit, so that a diagnosis and treatment can usually be provided straight away.
