## Tower Hamlets HIV/AIDS Services

The enclosed user-friendly guide is aimed at service providers. The colour coded wall chart covers HIV/AIDS service provision by Tower Hamlets Health Authority, Local Authority and the Voluntary Sector. It is hoped that this initiative will promote clearer understanding and better joint working between the three sectors. The chart will enable workers to give quick, effective, advice on alternative services available. Service users in turn will make better informed choices. Names and telephone numbers of key personnel across the broad spectrum of provision are given.

The wall chart will be sent to all HIV/AIDS voluntary organisations, hospital Social Work Departments and GUM clinics in the London area, HIV Co-ordinators in neighbouring boroughs. Within Tower Hamlets, distribution will cover field Social Work Teams, First Stop Shops, Housing Departments, Home Care Organisers, Libraries, Community Centres, Housing Estate bases; Health Promotions Service, District Nurses, the Grahame Hayton Centre, the Ambrose King Centre and the London Hospital generally.
