

The UK is currently contributing roughly £30 million a year to the Global Fund. However, a fair share according to our wealth means the UK ought to contribute £107 million in 2004. This is not unrealistic. France has already committed to give its fair share in 2004 (£93 million), as have Sweden and the Netherlands.

If developing countries are going to turn this epidemic around, the Fund needs to increase its grants. The UK should take a lead in ensuring that the Fund has at least £5 billion to allocate in 2005, and should pay its own fair share of that total.

The government must immediately announce that they will pay their fair share of the Global Fund's needs in 2004 and 2005.
