HOMELESSNESS

IF YOU NEED TO MOVE

If your home is no longer suitable, you can apply for rehousing on medical grounds. If needed, you will be able to get a flat without stairs or an extra room for a carer. The same procedures apply for both council and private tenants. In exceptional circumstances, owner occupiers can also be rehoused.

HARASSMENT

COUNCIL TENANTS . . .

If you are a council tenant and are being harassed because you have, or are believed to have HIV, contact your Neighbourhood Housing Office. It is Southwark Council policy to take all such cases of harassment seriously - to help tenants remain in their homes if possible or to rehouse them if necessary.
