This conference, held on the Saturday before World AIDS Day on December 1st, attempts to provide a forum for the principal dissenting voices on both the causes and potential threat of AIDS. It is arguable that there now exists an "aids establishment", which not only seeks to silence dissenting views on causation, but which for reasons of varying (and often contradictory) ideological, social and bueaucratic agendas, has exaggerated or misrepresented the extent, dangers and groups at risk. This establishment also defames any critics as "homophobic" or "irresponsible". Ironically, as some speakers will show, those who (quite understandably) seek to avoid the stigmatization of homosexuals may well have contributed to a discourse of repression and falsehood which will utlimately harm the very group they wish to defend.

Jad Adams is a journalist, author and television producer. He is author of AIDS: The HIV Myth, and, most recently, Tony Benn: A Biography. His 1987 television documentary AIDS: The Unheard Voices received the Royal Television Society Award for the best International Current Affairs Documentary, and was the first exposure in Britain of the non-HIV interpretation of AIDS causation. He has also contributed to a wide range of journals and magazines, including The Listener, New Scientist, The Lancet and The British Medical Journal.
