DEVELOPING EFFECTIVE HIV/AIDS SERVICES FOR BLACK PEOPLE

8-9 MAY 1991

A two day course which looks at HIV/AIDS service provision issues for black people.

This course examines a range of social, ethical and cultural issues and issues around sex and sexuality within the black communities. The impact of HIV/AIDS on specific black communities will be covered in detail.

The course will examine current models and practices within HIV/AIDS service provision to identify gaps in services for black people. It will consider practical ways of developing services which are appropriate and sensitive to the needs of black people.

The course will be useful to managers and policy makers as well as frontline staff responsible for providing direct services in the public and voluntary sectors.

BLACK CHILDREN & HIV/AIDS

31 MAY 1991

A one day course which examines in detail service provision issues for black children living with or directly affected by HIV & AIDS

The course looks at the gaps which exist in service

provision for black children living with or affected by HIV disease. The course will consider the needs of children, as well as their families, who have been affected by HIV/AIDS. The course consider a range of ethical as well as practical issues regarding pregnancy, childcare and the differing needs and wants of parents and children affected by HIV disease.

This course will be useful for managers and policy makers, frontline staff responsible for service provision to families affected by HIV disease, and teachers, social workers and child care specialists in the voluntary and statutory sectors.

BLACK WOMEN & HIV/AIDS

21 JUNE 1991

A one day course which examines the issues relevant for effective service provision for black women living with HIV & AIDS

The course looks at the models of service provision which are being developed for women living with HIV disease and considers the gaps which exist in service provision for black women. The course examines ways of identifying gaps in services for black women, as well as ways of developing services which are appropriate and accessible to black women.

This course will be useful for managers and policy makers concerned with the planning of HIV/AIDS services for women and families as well as frontline staff from the public and voluntary sectors.

DEVELOPING EFFECTIVE MANAGEMENT STRATEGIES

26-27 JUNE 1991

A two day course which looks at how to develop and manage services which are relevant and sensitive to the needs of black people living with and affected by HIV & AIDS

This course concentrates on the management, planning and organisational aspects relevant in providing HIV/AIDS services for black people. The course will examine current strategic policy and planning issues and management practices and will consider ways to evaluate current organisational structures in order to identify gaps in the planning and management of services.

The course will look at how practical and effective monitoring and evaluation systems and systems for quality assurance can be developed within an organisation and how these systems can be geared to setting clear targets for specific service outcomes.

The course will be useful for managers and policy makers concerned with planning HIV/AIDS services for black people.

HIV PREVENTION & HEALTH PROMOTION IN BLACK COMMUNITIES

8-9 JULY

A two day course which examines models and methods for developing effective HIV prevention and health promotion campaigns in black communities

This course looks in detail at current practices and materials for HIV prevention and health promotion work in black communities. The course examines the issues which are important when developing effective HIV prevention campaigns for black communities. Innovative models and practices of health promotion work with black communities are examined and practical ways of developing and applying local strategies are used during the course.

The course will be useful for health promotion and environmental health officers and health educators from the public, private and voluntary sectors.

HIV/AIDS & THE REFUGEE COMMUNITIES

18 JULY 1991

A one day course which examines the issues which are relevant in considering the impact of HIV infection and AIDS on the British refugee communities

The course examines a wide range of social, economic, cultural and linguistic factors which become relevant in the context of effective service provision for refugees living with or affected by HIV disease. The course examines the large gaps in service provision which exist and then looks in detail at models of care and support and HIV prevention with refugee communities.

This course will be useful for managers and policy makers as well as social workers, health advisers and other frontline staff from the public and voluntary sectors.

COURSE CODE: RL07 COURSE FEE: £125.00 per person

HIV/AIDS AWARENESS FOR BLACK VOLUNTARY ORGANISATIONS

A one day course designed for black voluntary organisations and community groups which examines the facts and the fears around HIV infection, HIV transmission and HIV disease

The course looks in detail at what HIV and AIDS are, how HIV is and is not transmitted, how HIV infection can be prevented. A wide range of issues which are relevant for black people living with HIV disease are examined. The course also looks at the practical issues for black voluntary organisations and community groups which are considering developing HIV/AIDS services.

The course will be useful for managers, staff and volunteers from black voluntary organisations and community groups. This course is open to members of the African, Asian and African-Caribbean communities.
