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

Training for Mental Health Workers Improving Practice with Lesbians & Gay Men.

pace has been funded for three years by The King's Fund to enable us to offer low cost training for all staff working in Mental Health Services.

Recent research indicates that:

- homophobia has a negative effect on Lesbian and Gay mental health
- service users often experience prejudice and isolation within services
- mental health workers have rarely had any training around sexuality issues.

In-House Courses

For organisations in the London area, a course will cost £150 per day. For organisations outside London, a course will cost £350 per day.




These courses will be run by experienced lesbian & gay trainers with a background in Mental Health and will cover the following:




pace believes the design and content of our courses allows participants safety and space to explore both personal and practices and developing more effective services.

Basic HIV/AIDS Awareness

Participants' personal and professional concerns around HIV/AIDS; myths and misinformation; transmission; symptoms, disease progression, treatment and prognosis; social/psychological implications of an HIV diagnosis; testing and confidentiality.

Advanced HIV Update

The current epidemiology. Disease progression related to HIV, including the major opportunistic infections; current thinking around treatment options, including combination therapies, holistic therapies; current debates around adherence and compliance; the changing needs of people living with and affected by HIV.

Drugs, Alcohol & HIV

The effects of alcohol on the immune system; comparison of societal and participants' own attitudes; the different uses of alcohol and drugs; the links between alcohol and drugs as a disinhibitor and how this affects people's behaviour and judgement; the relationship between alcohol, drugs and safer sex; HIV, pressure and stress and how alcohol and drugs may reduce or potentiate these stresses.
