

s the AIDS epidemic unfolds, the profound implications of HIV infection on the practice

of neurology, psychiatry and neuropsychology are becoming appreciated. Overt neurological complications of HIV infection are recognized in nearly 40% of all patients with AIDS and 10% of all AIDS patients first present with symptoms of nervous system pathology on autopsy. The myriad psychiatric and psychological aspects of this disease involve not only the organic effects of primary HIV and secondary opportunistic infections but also the protean behavioral and psychosocial issues which arise following the diagnosis of a dementing, invariably fatal illness.

Superimposed upon this bleak vision is the hope that has arisen from the recent major advances in our understanding of HIV infection and its effect upon the nervous system. In the fight against this epidemic, progress in the basic and clinical sciences has proceeded at a rate unequalled in the history of biomedical science. To address the need to disseminate this critical new information and to provide a forum for its discussion among researchers in the field, we have established the Neurological and Neuropsychological Complications of HIV Infection as an annual satellite meeting prior to the International Conference on AIDS. At our first meeting, held in Quebec City last year, 220 scientists and clinicians from around the world met to share their results and ideas. With this second annual meeting, we have expanded both its breadth and international scope. It is our fervent hope that with this meeting will come the knowledge. insight and international cooperation that will lead to our understanding and cure of HIV
