AIDS is caused by a virus, HIV. Once you have HIV, your body's defences can have trouble fighting off other diseases. At present there is no cure or vaccine for AIDS, although treatment is available to help people with HIV.

HIV is most often spread by:

- having sexual intercourse
- sharing needles or syringes

You can't tell by looking at someone if they have HIV. When people have HIV, they often look and feel healthy for years, however everyone who has the virus is infectious.

HIV/AIDS UPDATE

- Lothian has the UK's biggest HIV problem
- Over a thousand people in Edinburgh have had a positive HIV test



- Of the men and women who had a positive test last year, more were infected HETEROSEXUALLY than homosexually or through needle sharing
- HIV is spreading through the population in Edinburgh. 1 in 100 men and 1 in 250 women aged 15 – 45 now have the virus
- Most people understand the basic facts about HIV and AIDS. HOWEVER most people are still saying... "It won't happen to me"
- We can all protect ourselves if we decide to TAKE CARE WITH SEX

What does TAKING CARE mean for you?

- Choosing not to have a sexual relationship?
- Choosing not to have intercourse?
- Using condoms to reduce the risk if you do have intercourse?
- Being faithful to a faithful partner?
- Never sharing needles or syringes?

Testing for HIV Infection



Are you worried about HIV infection?

Both the Edinburgh Royal Infirmary and the City Hospital offer counselling to help you decide about taking the test, testing, and advice once a result is available.

The services are **strictly confidential** No information or test results will be passed on to your doctor, or to anyone else, without your permission.

If you do not have HIV, advice is available on how to keep safe in future. If you have the virus, medical services, advice and counselling are available. There's a lot that can now be done to help people with HIV keep well. Support is also available for partners, families and friends.

You can get condoms free from:

- **Family Planning Clinics**
- **The Brook Advisory Centre**



Approved condoms carry the kite mark. Check the 'use by' date.

To get condoms **free** from Family Planning Clinics or the Brook Advisory Centre, just drop in and ask for a C card. No appointment is necessary. With the card, you can pick up free condoms.

Clean Needles and Safe Disposal Containers

If you are injecting drugs, sharing needles puts you in danger of HIV infection. Clean needles, syringes, swabs and containers to ensure safe disposal are available **free** from Injection Equipment Exchanges.
